Key tasks and responsibilities

A bit about us

We are a vibrant and award-winning Public Health team within Somerset Council. The post holder will be based within Public Health Operations and work across a wide range of public health areas, in addition to working with other local authority health and community partners.

Here's what you can expect to be doing

This is a 3 year apprenticeship training programme to become a Public Health Practitioner gaining a BSc in Public Health (Hons) and eligibility to apply to and join the <u>UK Public Health Register (UKPHR)</u> You will be supported by the University of the West of England for a proportion of the week and the rest of your time will be spent on a variety of programme areas within the local authority communities and public health undertaking different public health tasks and projects.

As a Public Health Apprentice, you will work in partnership with colleagues in Communities, Public Health, the Council and other organisations to improve health outcomes and reduce health inequalities in Somerset. You will also support the planning, delivery and evaluation of public health initiatives.

You will be based in Public Health Operations (Public Health Nursing and Public Health lifestyle services) and work in specified areas of public health and across portfolio areas in line with the learning on the degree programme and the business need.

You will work across the three domains of public health as and when required:

- Health Improvement
- Health Protection
- Healthcare Public Health
- To engage fully in the apprenticeship programme, ensuring that every effort is made to attend all taught and remote sessions, scheduled assessor visits and that work is submitted in line with target dates set.
- To contribute to the assessment of population health needs and to contribute to the planning or commissioning of services to meet those needs.
- To audit and evaluate programmes/projects and contribute to the redesign of services and interventions to improve health outcomes and reduce health inequalities.



- Be able to review the evidence base for the most effective practice and the delivery of value for money in public health.
- To promote ethical practice and demonstrate an understanding of the ethical dilemmas faced when promoting population health & reducing health inequalities
- To contribute to the review and design of policies and strategies to improve health outcomes and reduce health inequalities.
- Contribute to effective joint working and partnerships to plan and implement programmes and services that share goals and priorities and to communicate with others to improve health outcomes and reduce health inequalities, including delivery of complex information.
